Important Announcement

S. S. A. MAIL THIEF CAUGHT

Many cases of non-receipt of dues sent to the SSA offices caused us to complain to the Post Office.

When it became apparent that this was the result of theft, the post office investigators traced our mail and caught an employee of the building who had been stealing part of the mail from our office in the early morning. Cards were immediately sent to all 1937 members, asking in what form their dues had been paid. These were followed by letters notifying members to stop payment on checks and money orders. We strongly urge you not to send cash through the mail. If you have written us or sent dues and not had a reply, you will know that we never received your letter.
