

**CAA STATISTICS**

The latest statistics received from the Civil Aeronautics Authority show a total of 22,983 pilot certificates on January 1, 1939. This is an increase of more than 5,000 pilots and of more than 800 aircraft since January 1, 1938. Uncertificated but identified aircraft totalled 1,159 have been reduced from 1,684 a year previous.

The CAA listed 172 certificated glider pilots and 221 gliders of which 45 were certificated on January 1. A year ago there were 161 certificated glider pilots and 273 gliders, of which 47 held Federal Certificates.
