

5. Authority to issue the A, B, and C glider licenses.

"The Soaring Society of America shall be empowered to charge nominal fees in order to efficiently carry out the responsibilities delegated above.

"In accordance with the authority vested in The Soaring Society of America by this agreement, it shall definitely be the responsibility of The Soaring Society of America to:

a. Keep suitable file records on the appointment of all gliding and soaring contest officials and official Glider Observers. Applications for appointment of such officials, as well as cards certifying to such appointment, shall be provided by The Soaring Society of America to interested and qualified officials.

b. Keep suitable file records on issuance of A, B, and C glider licenses. Applications for all glider licenses shall be provided by The Soaring Society of America to all official Glider Observers, upon request, without charge.

c. Provide all necessary record report forms, in blank, as well as barographs, and other necessary instruments, to official Glider Observers who desire to conduct an official national or international glider record attempt. In this connection, The National Aeronautic Association will assist when so requested."
