

ANNUAL MEETING

In accordance with Section 1, Article III of the By-laws of the SSA, as amended at the meeting of July 7, 1940, the annual meeting of the Society is hereby called for July 5, 1941. Please note that eight directorships expire but only six directors will be elected by the SSA members. The remaining two directors will be elected as directors at large for a term of one year by the Board of Directors of the SSA.

Method of voting: Only Associate, Active and Life members in good standing are eligible to vote. Subscribers to SOARING are not eligible to cast a ballot. Each member will vote for six directors listing them in the order of his preference. The six names shall be writ-

ten on a sheet of plain paper and mailed in a sealed envelope to the SSA office, Box 71, Elmira, New York. All votes must be mailed not later than midnight July 1, 1941.

It is important that your name appear on the outside of the envelope containing your ballot, so that your eligibility to vote may be checked in the membership files. The ballot need not contain your name.

All ballots will be opened and counted by a disinterested person, and the results of the balloting will be made known at the annual meeting.

Whom to choose: 1. Nominate for re-election retired directors who have been active in useful service.

2. Nominate members who have distinguished themselves as soaring pilots and who may be looked to for leadership in the future—the "new blood" in the directorate.

3. Nominate members who are active in different regional groups throughout the U. S. so that each section of the country may have representation in the directorate.

4. Each director elected at the annual meeting will serve for a term of three years.
