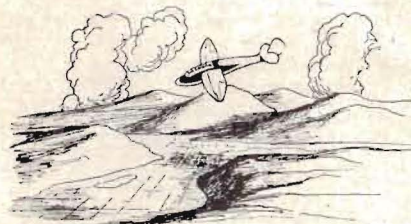


... Speaking of performance, let's look at the records



DISTANCE . . . In the national contest of 1940, Robert M. Stanley, former chief test pilot for Bell Aircraft Corp., successfully completed a flight of 216 miles, from Elmira, N. Y. to Washington, D. C. This flight set a national distance record for 2-place gliders.



ALTITUDE . . . Flown by the late Major Lewin Barringer, a Schweizer Sailplane established a national 2-place altitude record of 14,000 feet above release, at Sun Valley, Idaho in August, 1940.
