SL-16-1001	B&W on 400 ft. reel	12.0 min.	"Frank Hawks' Transcontinental Glider Tow, 1930; and First National Soaring Contest, Elmira, 1930." Shows Hawks' take-off in Franklin glider from San Diego and being welcomed in New York by Grover Whalen. Shows first national meet at South Mountain take-off site near Elmira, with early glider pioneers such as R. E. Franklin, Gus Haller, Jack O'Meara, Wolf Hirth, Al Hastings (first national champion), formation flying, etc.	\$2.50
SL-16-1002	B&W on 400 ft. reel	9.9 min.	"Second National Soaring Contest, Elmira, N.Y., 1931." Shows launchings at South Mountain and East Ridge, and landings at Caton Avenue Airport in South Elmira, and scenes with Hawley Bowlus, Al Hastings, Bud Iszard, Bill Purcell, Warren Eaton, R. A. Barnaby, Martin Schempp, Percy Pierce, R. E. Franklin with his special closed cockpit extra span glider, etc.	\$2.50
SL-16-1003	B&W on 800 ft. reel	19.4 min.	"Flying With The Toledo Gliding Club, 1933-35." Shows activities of this Club during these early days of gliding near and at the shores of Lake Erie, and the search for gliding sites. Filmed by E. F. Knight.	\$3.50
SL-16-1004	B&W on 800 ft. reel	21.0 min.	"Plane Sailing." Filmed by Philip Wills of Great Britain about 1937. Shows early British contests and various designs of sailplanes of that era. (Filmed originally for sound but printed with titles for use as a silent film. Should be projected at sound speed).	\$4.00
SL-16-1005	B&W on 400 ft. reel	15.1 min.	"Cloud-Cuckoo." "A Drama in Two Flick Rolls Featuring Wilbur Sparrow and Harold Hawk." A clever cartoon of training in primaries made by Lawrence Wright of Great Britain.	\$3.00
SL-16-1006	B&W on 400 ft. reel	5.2 min.	"Rabbits In The Air" or "From Groundhopper To Grunau." A short comedy of glider student activities. Made by Lawrence Wright of Great Britain.	\$1.50
*SL-16-1007	B&W on 400 ft. reel	17.1 min.	"The National Glider Meet, Sept. 21 to Oct. 5, 1930, Elmira, N.Y." This film was made by Warren E. Eaton, an outstanding proponent of gliding as a sport and for youth training in aviation. It begins with the first National Contest held near Elmira, N.Y., and follows with gliding scenes during the early 1930's. The film is presented as originally edited by Warren Eaton.	\$2.50
*SL-16-1008	B&W on 3 400 ft. reels	34.0 min.	"Soaring—A Story of Motorless Flight." A film depicting gliding and soaring activities at sites where this sport was popular during the early 1930's. Film is concerned primarily with student training in Germany at the Hornberg gliding school, with Wolf Hirth demonstrating techniques and flight maneuvers. Various types of gliders and methods of launching are shown. Gliding club activities in Switzerland are shown both in summer and in winter. Activities at Ellenville and Elmira, N.Y., are also included.	\$4.50

A basic instructional film on aerodynamics for classroom work beginning with gliders in flight and showing, through animated diagrams, why gliders can be controlled in flight. Shows by diagrams the various controls and their functions and their application to typical small airplanes. Eastman Classroom Films.	\$2.50
SL-16-2001	Color on 400 ft. reel	18.8 min.	"The Rochester Soaring Club." Presentation of the Club's first year of its activities, 1949. Shows flying activities of this club from its charter membership through the first glider ride taken by photographer, activities at the Club's home base at Genesee Airport, participation in the 6th National Soaring Contest at Elmira and at the Snowbird Meet.	\$3.50
SL-16-2002	Color on 400 ft. reel	12.4 min.	"Motorless Flight." A film record of the 20th National Soaring Contest at Elmira in 1953, and scenes from the Mid-Atlantic Soaring Association's flying activities near Washington, D.C. Shows numerous aerial views. Has no descriptive titles. Photographed by Harold Fawcett. (A silent film but should be projected at sound speed).	\$3.00
SL-16-2003	Color on 1200 ft. reel	26.0 min.	"The Mountain Wave." U.S. Airforce Research Center Film record of Phase II, 1951-52, of the wave and jetstream phenomena at Bishop, California. (Silent film but should be projected at sound speed).	\$8.50
*SL-16-2004	Color on 800 ft. reel	18.9 min.	"Wings Of The Nation In Switzerland." The World Gliding Championships held at Semadeni, Switzerland, in 1948.
