## NOTE! RULES CHANGES

New changes to the rules for FAI soaring awards were made by CVSM, FAI's Committee for Soaring, at their March, 1959, meeting and are now effective for all flight attempts in the U.S. For triangular courses, each leg must be at least 28% of the total course length flown. Turning points for goal and return, dog leg or triangular course flights must be declared in writing prior to take-off. The turn point(s) declaration must be timed and dated, signed by the pilot and a witnessing SSA Official Observer and attached to the application form for the award flown.

## FAI AWARDS

Applications for FAI Soaring Awards should be mailed to SSA, Box 66071, Los Angeles 66, Calif. The envelope must bear a postmark date less than six months from the time of the flight or the application will not be honored. This eliminates discrepancies at the time badges are completed and insures the correct assignment of numbers. Approved legs are kept in a pending file by SSA until badge requirements are completed.

## SEW-ON EMBLEMS
