Reeves. For once, E. J. was at a loss for words to express appreciation for this most significant award.

It was announced that Dewey J. Mancuso had been awarded the Paul E. Tuntland Memorial Award for 1959 for his two-part article "High Flight" in *Soaring* magazine. Unfortunately, he was not present to receive his mounted certificate in person.

Dick Schreder was presented the perpetual Larissa Stroukoff Memorial Trophy and associated cash award for the third year in a row, for the best goal and return flight during the Championships just concluded; his 338.5 mile record-breaking performance on August 4th. A mounted certificate forms part of this award, also.

E. J. Reeves then made a special presentation to Mr. & Mrs. Wills for being what they are and enhancing the atmosphere of the contest with their presence, a bouquet of roses for Kitty and a new Texas hat for Philip, which about brought the house down.

Texas hats were also presented by the Odessa Chuck Wagon Gang to Dr. Selvidge, Oats Schwarzenberger and Beaumont Cooley, Contest Director, in appreciation of their efforts connected with the Championships.

Beau Cooley presented a special trophy to Joe Emons for the best effort in a medium performance sailplane in recognition of his many attempts at Gold C distance, qualification flight on the first day of the contest and subsequent creditable flights.

Ray Hedges, Executive Vice President of the Odessa C of C, presented a special plaque on behalf of a member of the Chuck Wagon Gang, jeweler Abe Gerson, to Philip Wills as the contestant who came the greatest distance to compete.

Contest performance trophies were then presented to: Kit Drew, for the best performance in an OSTIV Standard Class sailplane, a Ka-6B, 6095 points; Rudy Allemann, for second best OSTIV Standard Class performance, a Ka-6CR, 5534 points;

Gordon Oates from Canada, for 6th place in the final standings, 5883 points; Kit Drew, 5th place, 6095; Philip Wills, 4th place, 6121; A. J. Smith, 3rd place, 6374; and Bernie Carris, 2nd place, 6516 points.

The major award of the evening, the perpetual Richard C. duPont Memorial Trophy, was then presented to Dick Schreder, as the 1960 U.S. National Soaring Champion. A cash award and engraved bronze medalion of the trophy accompanied the trophy.

The final item on the program was the presentation to Dick Schreder, as the new champion, of an honorary membership in the Odessa Chuck Wagon Gang by the Gang's boss, J. D. Henderson. With the membership came a special western shirt, trademark of the Gang, and engraved Texas Plaque.

With that the Nationals were over and everyone went his separate way with a warm feeling of good fellowship, looking forward to the time when they meet again in sporting soaring competition.
