SL-8-1002	B&W on 200 ft. reel	17.3 min.	"The 13th National Soaring Contest, at Elmira, 1946." A fine film on this contest held at Harris Hill in July, 1946. Filmed by Jack Perine.	\$2.00
SL-8-1012	Color on 200 ft. reel	4.2 min.	"Sailing the Skies." A short commercially-produced color film made about 1942. Shows scenes of typical activities found at a soaring meet. Locale is Harris Hill near Elmira, N.Y. Produced by World in Color Films. (See SL-16-1016, for 16mm B&W version and SL-16-2008 for 16mm Color version of this film.)	\$1.00
SL-8-1013	Color on 3 200 ft. reels	41.7 min.	"The World Gliding Championships, Leszno, Poland, 1958." An interesting color film made by Paul Bikle while he was a participant in this world meet. Has no scene titles.	\$3.00
SL-8-1014	Color on 200 ft. reel	16.4 min.	"The Torrey Pines Meet — 1959." A color film showing activities surrounding this annual soaring meet held in February along the shore of the Pacific Ocean in Southern California. Has no titles but contains interesting views of the area from sailplanes. Filmed by Paul Bikle.	\$2.00
SL-16-1013	B&W on 400 ft. reel	14.2 min.	"Design and Construction of the Grunau 7." An unusual film which takes the viewer from the inception in model form of this outstanding early high-performance sailplane, through its drafting-board design and construction stages to its final flight tests. Contains some amusing sequences.	\$2.50
SL-16-1014	B&W on 400 ft. reel	17.7 min.	"Segelflug Erinnerungen Von Wolf Hirth." Literally "sailplane recollections of Wolf Hirth." An interesting series of scenes about some of the early gliding experiences of this great sailplane pilot.	\$2.50
SL-16-1015	B&W on 400 ft. reel	13.4 min.	"Segelflieger Uber Sudamerika." An early film about Wolf Hirth and other sailplane pilots searching for suitable gliding sites in several areas of the western hemisphere.	\$2.50
SL-16-1016	B&W on 400 ft. reel	4.2 min.	"Sailing the Skies." A short commercially-produced film made about 1942. Shows scenes of typical activities found at a soaring meet. SL-16-1017	B&W on 400 ft. reel	18.7 min.	"26th National Soaring Contest, Elmira, N.Y., 1959." A fine film on the 26th National Meet held at Harris Hill, Elmira, N.Y., where Dick Johnson won the coveted National Championship. Filmed by Jack Perine.	\$2.50
SL-16-1018	B&W on 2 400 ft. reels	28.2 min.	"The Beginning of Soaring." Probably the earliest existing collection of filmed sequences of pioneering designs and flight tests of gliders which were the forerunners of today's high-performance sailplanes. Covers the period of 1920-1922 in Europe, with glider meets at Ferrand, France, and principally at the Wasserkuppe. Shows E.T. Allen of M.I.T. as first U.S. participant in an international meet. Includes the first flight of a two-place glider and the first motion pictures taken from a glider. From U.S. Air Force Film Archives and Fokker Aircraft Company.	\$4.00
SL-16-2007	Color on 400 ft. reel	16.8 min.	"National Soaring Contest, 1939." An early color film on the 10th National contest held at Harris Hill Elmira, N.Y. Includes personalities active during this era, such as Floyd Sweet, Youston Sekella, Chet Decker, Helen Montgomery, etc., and sailplane designer Ernest Schweizer. Filmed by Loomis & Hall, Inc., Elmira, N.Y.	\$4.00
SL-16-2008	Color on 400 ft. reel	4.2 min.	"Sailing the Skies." A short commercially-produced color film made about 1942. Shows scenes of typical activities found at a soaring meet, with both winch and airplane launchings of sailplanes flown by Floyd Sweet and Youston Sekella. Locale is Harris Hill near Elmira, N.Y. Produced by World In Color Productions. (See SL-8-1013 for 8mm color version and SL-16-1016 for 16mm B&W version of this film).	\$1.50
SL-16-2009	Color on 400 ft. reel	9.1 min.	"Flying the X-1, X-2 and X-15 as Gliders." This unusual film shows the launching and flight testing of these experimental supersonic rocket propelled aircraft for stability tests prior to installing their propulsion machinery. SD-16-6011	B&W on 400 ft. reel	11.0 min.	"Silent Wings." A prewar sports film made for showing in theatres as a short subject. Depicts soaring as it was practiced during the 1930's. Produced by RKO-Pathé.	\$3.50
