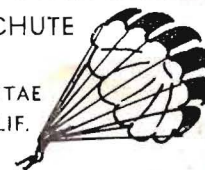

BIKLE RE-ELECTED PRESIDENT

At their August 11th Board meeting, the SSA Directors re-elected Paul F. Bikle to be president of the Society for the calendar year 1962. He is currently serving his first term in that office. Other officers and Directors-at-Large for 1962 were elected at the same meeting. The two vice-presidents will be Tom Page and John D. Ryan. The treasurer and secretary were re-elected, Bertha M. Ryan and Joseph M. Robertson, respectively.

Maj. Gen. Kenneth P. McNaughton, USAF (Ret.) was elected to fill the position of sixth Director-at-large, created by a recent bylaws amendment, for the remainder of 1961. Then he and the remaining five Directors-at-Large, Joseph M. Robertson, Bertha M. Ryan, Paul A. Schweizer, Dr. Harner Selvidge and Lt. Col. Floyd J. Sweet, USAF, were all re-elected for the year 1962.

SSA TO BID FOR 1963 WORLD CHAMPIONSHIPS

One of the most significant decisions made by the SSA Directors at their August 11th meeting was to submit a bid to host the 1963 World Soaring Championships in the United States. Although definite commitments for the outside support that would be necessary to sponsor such an event had not been obtained, a majority of the 16 Directors present felt that SSA should submit the best bid it can by the deadline of Oct. 31, 1961.

CARSEY AND LINCOLN ADDED TO HALL OF FAME

The Helms Athletic Foundation, Los Angeles, Calif., has announced that two noted personalities in the sport of soaring, Jon D. Carsey and Joseph C. Lincoln, have been elected to the Helms Hall Soaring Hall of Fame, following recommendations made by the SSA.
