## 5-Minute C Badges to End September 4, 1962

A termination date has been set for the awarding of C Badges for simple, 5-minute soaring flights. After September 3, 1962, at 11:59 P.M., pilots will be able to earn A, B and C Badges only through the SSA ABC Program.

## SCHWEIZER 2-32 FLIES
