

SSA MEMBERSHIP CONTEST

Contest Rules

1. The Contest starts June 1st and closes Dec. 31, 1962.

2. There will be two contest sections, one for Number-of-Members-Obtained and one for Suggestions.

3. Any individual, except SSA employees, officers, directors and members of the Membership Committee, may compete by sponsoring new members and, optionally, submitting a suggestion entry with each. Each new member sponsored is permitted to submit a suggestion entry, also. Note that there is no club category, this contest is open to *individuals* only.

4. Any person not an SSA member between Jan. 1, 1962, and May 31, 1962, will qualify as a new member; however, points credited for former members that rejoin will be at 1/2 the regular scale.

5. Each suggestion entry shall be limited to a 25-word constructive suggestion on how to promote soaring and/or SSA. Prizes will be awarded for the three best suggestions submitted, as determined by the SSA Membership Committee. All entries become the property of SSA.

6. A new membership application must include name, address, phone number and appropriate dues and have noted thereon the sponsor's name and the word "SPONSOR." If suggestion entries are included, each must be on a separate piece of paper with the name of the author printed below it.

7. In awarding prizes for the number of new members obtained, scoring shall be done on the basis of:

Industrial Member	3

8. Winners will be notified by mail in Jan., 1963, and their names will be published in the Feb., 1963, issue of *Soaring*.
