

## Chapter Rebates Sent

On October 1st, annual partial SSA dues rebates were computed for 29 of SSA's Chapters which totaled \$1368. Checks were mailed to most of the Chapters, subsequently, and the rest await clarification of membership roster discrepancies. The remaining 25 Chapters which qualify for annual rebates received theirs in April, totaling \$805. The partial rebates are given to the Chapters on the basis of \$2 for each SSA voting member and \$1 for each Family Member on their roster.

SSA Chapters are approved organizations that have at least seven voting members of SSA and in which all other members hold some grade of SSA membership. The 55 current Chapter rosters comprise 30% of SSA's total membership. The partial dues rebate is a benefit given to those Chapters which maintain 100% voting members and Student Members on their rosters (no Associates). All Chapters are given a number of other benefits which are listed in SSA's Item #41, an information sheet on the subject of SSA Chapters. Copies of Item #41 are available from SSA.

## New SSA State Governor

There have been a few changes in the SSA State Governors since the 1962 SSA Soaring Directory was published, as follows:

Washington state has a new Governor, Cecil M. Craig of 16710 - 2nd Place South, Seattle 88, recently appointed by President Paul Bikle upon recommendation of the Regional Director for that region.

North Florida lost its Governor when Capt. Alfred H. Uhalt, Jr., USAF, was transferred to California by Uncle Sam, and East Texas lost its Governor with the passing of Jon Carsey.

Members desiring to serve the Society as SSA State Governors for any area not so represented should volunteer to their Regional Director.

SSA voting members in regions 1, 2, 6, 11 and 12 are reminded that they will be electing Regional Directors for three-year terms this December and should be thinking of whom they wish to nominate.
