The final standings showed that Stu Schweizer, defending champion, had retained his title. He was closely followed by Bud Briggs and Nate Frank. The team of Dale Gustin and Bill Frutchy won the team trophy with Victor Fenn and Martin Jurgeit of the Southern Ontario Soaring Association the runners-up. The novice trophy, awarded to the top non-Silver Badge pilot, was awarded to Livingston Morris with his 1-26 that had been completed this spring. The runner-up was Grayson Starnier. The club championship was taken by the "Soaring Dutchmen," with the Southern Ontario Soaring Association taking second honors.

A meet of any type can only be considered successful by those attending as the basic aims are successfully accomplished. The interest and wholehearted participation by those attending was typical of the atmosphere that has prevailed at all the annual 1-26 Regattas. With nearly 200 1-26's now flying in this country and Canada, interest in the one-design concept continues to grow. More local 1-26 regattas are being held each year. Informal get-togethers on weekends enables the pilots to meet in friendly competition for FAI awards and for the ultimate in soaring sport, cross-country flying.

of the Smithsonian Institution in Washington, D. C., on Wednesday, October 24th at 3:00 P.M. These plaques will list all past and future pilots who have been issued FAI Gold and Diamond Soaring Badges by FAI's representative for soaring in the U.S., the Soaring Society of America.

The Smithsonian has mailed invitations to attend the dedication ceremonies to a special list of soaring notables. Each invitation includes the recipient's family. However, attendance is not restricted to those bearing invitations so the door is open to other soaring enthusiasts as well, and those who can attend would add to the success of the event by their presence.

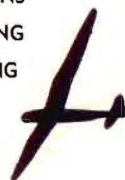
