



The British Elliotts EON Type 463 sailplane. A copy of this type is to be the British Standard Class entry in the World Soaring Championships at Junin, Argentina, during February. Pilot will be Brig.-Gen. Anthony J. Deane-Drummond. A 463 was used by A. D. Piggott in winning the 1962 British Standard Class Championship. He felt he was able to compete on equal terms with the larger span Skylark 3's as well as having an easier time of it in all respects, especially ground handling. Each wing weighs less than 100 pounds and the empty weight is only 380 lb. The horizontal tail can be unlocked and folded up alongside the fin.
