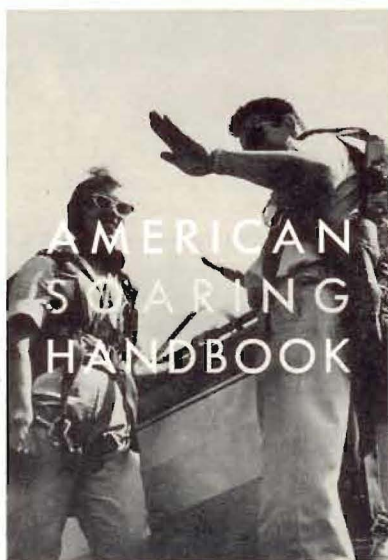

## Inspection Stickers

Free inspection stickers are being distributed, upon request, to aircraft owners by the Federal Aviation Agency to remind them of the date of their next periodic aircraft inspection.

Its use is not mandatory, but FAA Administrator N. E. Halaby urges all aircraft owners to take advantage of this new service. The stickers should help prevent aircraft from being flown that have not had their periodic inspections.

The stickers (FAA Form 2912) may be obtained from any FAA inspector or participating authorized inspectors upon presentation of the aircraft logbook.
