# LENNIE PINS ISSUED

Following the close of the last SSA Directors' meeting a new award was officially recognized and sanctioned by the Soaring Society of America. This award, "The Symons Wave Memorial Award," has a very deserving background and was recently re-established as previously mentioned in the November issue of *Soaring*.

The first issuance of pins and plaques began the later part of January to those persons who had distinguished themselves in the art of wave soaring. The three different lennie pins denote having soared to great heights in wave conditions, as follows: 1-lennie, 25-35,000 ft.; 2-lennie, 35-40,000 ft.; 3-lennie, over 40,000 ft. Persons who have flown over the minimum of 25,000 feet are eligible to register for their lennie awards plus the fact that they automatically are registered as recipients for the "Symons Wave Memorial" plaque, which is in remembrance of the late wave flight pioneer, Robert Symons.
