Liaison Officers Needed For Oxygen Training Program

Announcement of further details of the Oxygen Training Program has been delayed by the failure of some Regional Directors to name liaison officers to conduct the program in their regions. The names trickled to a halt after 12 liaison men were named for Regions 8, 9, 11, and 12 by mid-October. I should include Region 7, because I'm it.

The absolute deadline for an effective start ahead of late winter wave conditions is NOVEMBER 30. Regions in which no liaison men, directors or otherwise, have been named by that date will be omitted from the program. Please refer to my earlier circular letter request. ACTION REQUESTED.

The naming of all SSA State Governors in a region as liaison for this program is not necessarily the best solution unless AF Physiological Training Units are equally widely distributed in the particular Region. There is much to be said for oxygen training program liaison officers from wave soaring sites near an AF altitude chamber facility.
