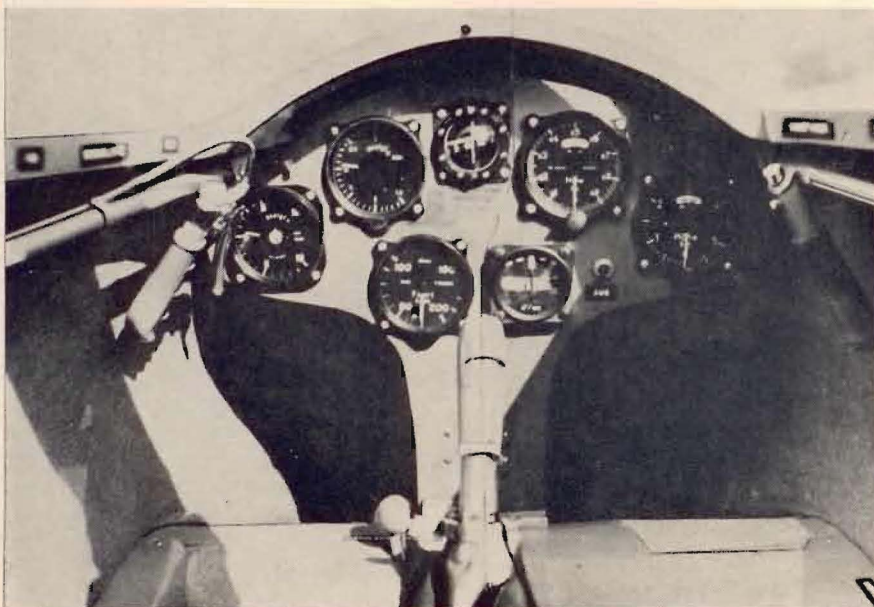


STANDARD AUSTRIA SH



The Standard Austria SH has come out on top during the recent Flight Test and Evaluation Course conducted by OSTIV at Varese, Italy and is now in full production at the Schempp-Hirth plant, Kirchheim-Teck, West Germany (see photo at top). German Nationals

Former World Soaring Champion, Heinz Hueth, won for the sixth time, the German National Championships, held this year from May 17th through May 28th at the Roth air base, Nuernberg, West Germany. Hueth was flying a Schleicher Ka-6 and amassed a total of 5049.8 points.

A 26-year old student from Darmstadt, Gerhard Waibel, won in the Open Class with 5853.8 points, flying a Darmstadt D-36-V-1 sailplane.

Sixty three sailplanes competed in the Nationals; 51 in the Standard Class, 42 of which were Ka-6s. Newcomer at the competition was the Boelkow "Phoebus" a 15 meter version of the "Phoenix".
