

# SAA LIFE MEMBERSHIP CONTEST RULES AND PRIZES

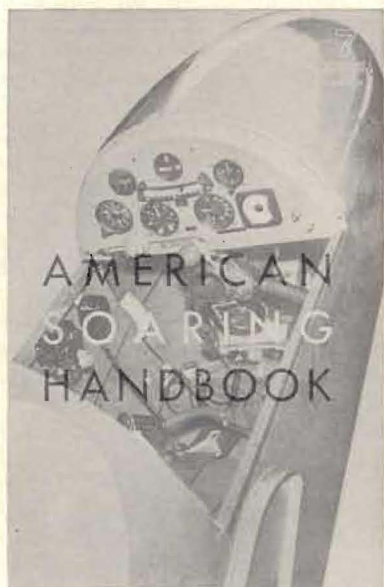

The Austrian Musger MG-23SL sailplane, latest model of this series. Earl Menefee, U. S. Distributor, of 1855 Ednamary Way, of Mountain View, Calif., has an MG-23 which he imported a number of years ago. The SL (Super Leistung or Performance) model differs from his in the following ways: 1, wheel lowered 2 inches; 2, rudder raised 7 inches; 3, canopy extended forward; 4, wing tip bodies eliminated; 5, aileron shape slightly altered; 6, maximum glide ratio raised 2 points to 34:1; 7, seat adjustable to 6 positions; and 8, all handles, releases, etc., are built in flush with the cockpit walls. Of all-wood construction, it sells for \$3,030 plus freight and instruments.
